OCTOBER IS NATIONAL PEDESTRIAN SAFETY MONTH

Every person deserves safe streets - places where we can walk, bike, or roll without fear. Walkable streets make neighborhoods stronger, small businesses thrive, and our community more connected.

But there's still work to do to make that vision a reality in Macon-Bibb. In 2023, there were 85 pedestrian crashes and 15 pedestrian fatalities - a rate nearly 5x the national average. These aren't just numbers - they represent our friends, family, and neighbors.

For the past decade, Bike Walk Macon has worked to create safer streets by:

- **Advocating for the Complete Streets Policy** that ensures new and retrofitted roads serve all users, not just cars
- **Hosting Open Streets Macon programs** to reimagine what safe, connected streets can look like
- **Supporting infrastructure upgrades** like crosswalks, lighting, and traffic calming
